California SB 1383 & AB 827



Now that your green waste bin has been delivered, it's time to train your employees and students on how to have a successful organics recycling program! As a business owner, manager or school administrator of a business or school in California, you are required to comply with state laws Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) and Assembly Bill 827 (AB 827). SB 1383 becomes effective January 1, 2022, while AB 827 was effective July 1, 2020.

What is AB 827? A bill requiring businesses (except full service restaurants) and schools to provide adequately sized recycling containers in adequate locations, for all available streams (for example, organics and/or traditional recyclables) for employees, tenants, contractors, customers and students. Recycling containers must be color coded (as detailed below) and labeled with the accepted materials to be deposited in that container.

How often do employees need to be trained? At least once a year, and they must first be trained within 14 days of being on the premises. The following material must be included in the annual training.

What material goes in each container? The green bin will house organic waste, the blue bin will house traditional recyclables, and the black bin will house the trash (see graphic below for more details).


















What is contamination? Material being placed in the wrong bin. For example, food waste in the trash.

How will we know if we're contaminating? Managers must inspect collection containers. If contamination is found, managers must educate employees on the information in the graphic below.

How will the City know our business or school is compliant? City staff, Cal Recycle or a designee will come to inspect. Employees are required to allow inspectors on site to examine relevant locations and records.
